Who Are We?

The Church of the Spiral Tree (CST) is a non-profit, volunteer-staffed, ecumenical pagan/wiccan church, designed to foster a sense of community and family among pagans, both locally and in other regions of the country/world. It is an ecumenical church in that it encompasses all traditions, and is non-exclusive. It welcomes all who revere the Earth Mother and adhere to the tenets of the Wiccan Rede ("An it harm none, do as you will"), regardless of which tradition one is affiliated with. CST is also a Faerie Faith church, in that it has a goal of spreading the teachings of the Faerie Faith to all who are interested, and giving people better access to this ancient and beautiful Irish belief system. The Faerie Faith itself is a non-exclusive faith; one who is studying the Faerie Faith is always free to study other traditions or join other organizations.

Info About Our Services:

Ministers: CST, being a church, may ordain any member over the age of 18 a minister. The fee for this is \$35.00, and you must also be a paid member. This ordination is for life; you do not have to maintain your membership to continue to be a CST minister, but we would really appreciate it. Each year we have to renew our "Registered" status in various states in order for our ministers to be legal, and your continued membership fees help pay for this. Ministers are entitled to perform legal weddings, baptisms, and funerals. Ordination as a minister does not automatically confer "Elder" or "High Priest/ess" status upon anyone.

Subordinate Organizations: The main form of a local CST group is a Grove. This can be formed by at least three paid church members, who apply to CST for a charter. If you are interested in forming a Grove, simply find two other like-minded friends, and encourage them to send in their membership to CST, then apply to us for a Grove charter. The application and first year's fee is \$35.00. Note that whomever forms a Grove and runs it, including writing and performing rituals and teaching mysteries, does not automatically become a "High Priest/ess."

Note on Ministers and Groups: For those of you who wish to form a local group or become ordained as a minister, if you're somewhere besides Alabama or Georgia, you just need to let us know a bitahead of time.

For the group and the ministership to belegal, we need to be registered in your state. This takes a little time to get the paperwork done and sent in. We will register in other states as needed, as there's a bit of expense involved. Your membership fees and the fees for ordination (\$35) and forming a group (\$35) help pay for these costs. CST is already registered in Georgia, so anyone wishing to put together a local CST group there can do so. Ritual Link: You have the option of participating long-distance in our rituals, both lunar and sabbat. All you have to do is let us know that you want to do this, and tell us which rituals, either lunar, sabbat, or both, and before each of our planned rituals, we will mail, email, or FAX a copy of the ritual to you, along with the "kick-off" time and date of the ritual. This way, members who wish can do the same ritual the rest of the group is doing, at the same time, on the same day.

Let us know if you're interested in participating this way. As our rituals sometimes are not completely written till the night before, we need either an email address or FAX number to quickly send you the ritual.

MINUTES CHURCH OF THE SPIRAL TREE Annual Membership Meeting May 28, 2000

The meeting was called to order by Craig Kerr at 11:00 am, at Moondance, Dragon Hills, Carrollton, GA, with the following Directors and members present:

James C. Kerr, President; Rob Von Allmen, Vice-President; Linda C. Kerr, Secretary/Treasurer; Cliff Landis, Don Mikovitz, William & Linda Moore.

New Business

Nominations for election of officers and directors of the church: President: Craig Kerr; Vice-President: Robert von Allmen; Secretary/Treasurer: Linda Kerr; Member-at-Large: Cathy Rankin. As the absentee and mail-in ballots were not distributed to the membership prior to the meeting, these will be mailed out next week.

Results of election: Votes received are unanimous for President: Craig Kerr; Vice-President: Robert von Allmen; Secretary/Treasurer: Linda Kerr; and Member-at-Large: Cathy Rankin.

CST has over \$1000 in its account. Linda will be opening a savings or money market account soon to earn some interest on about half the money, while the other stays in the account for ready access.

We have about 50 members right now, most in Alabama and Georgia, with others in Alaska, New Jersey, and Florida. Several members are now ordained ministers.

We are getting a bit more member contributions to the newsletter, The Journey. Don was asked to re-submit his articles, "On the Back Porch With Nion," for publication. Linda will pull up the old ones from The Hazel Nut.

Ministering to inmates was discussed. A couple of members have some previous experience at it, and in some cases some very favorable results. A woman in Valley, AL has expressed interest in joining CST and ministering at a prison near her.

CST is still trying to do lunar rituals, but so far this year only two have taken place. The last one, a healing circle in May, went really well. We just don't have any people volunteering to do rituals right now. Of the sabbat rituals, we've held Imbolc and May Day. Spring Equinox was canceled because of SerpentStone's festival that same weekend.

Some possible fund-raising ideas were discussed. Last year we tried to set boxes around the Auburn University campus to collect things that students throw away, and sell them at a yard sale, but the Housing people already have that option tied up. And we can't collect things at dumpsters. So that idea, while a good one, just won't work at Auburn. Other ideas are needed.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned at 11:30 am.

MINUTES CST Board of Directors June 17, 2000

The meeting was called to order by Craig Kerr at 8:00 am, at Waverly, Alabama, with the following Directors and members present:

James C. Kerr, President; Rob Von Allmen, Vice-President, Linda C. Kerr, Secretary-Treasurer; and Cathy Rankin, Member-at-Large.

Old Business

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

New Business

Due to a wedding, the Lammas ritual will be re-scheduled for August 12.

The lunar rituals will continue to be scheduled, but will only take place if someone volunteers to write and run them. This year they always occur on a weekend when Craig and Linda are out of town.

Linda forgot to mail out notices and absentee ballots prior to the General Membership meeting this year, so ballots were mailed out late. Results of the officer elections will be shown in the Minutes from the General Membership meeting, in this issue. It was decided that Linda needs a clone.

Rob suggested we have two General Membership meetings - the main one at Moondance to elect officers, and another at FallFling in November. The Membership meeting this year at Moondance was attended by all CST members present at Moondance. Having another one at FallFling may draw some members who don't normally attend Moondance, or who weren't able to make it.

CST has plenty of operating funds for the year. It had already been decided at the previous BOD meeting to put some of the money in a saving account of some sort; this will be accomplished this month.

Stormy had suggested earlier that we do some type of fund-raising to build a church building or purchase land; maybe have pagan-friendly bands play at Bodega's, a bar in Auburn. This was done last year to help a community member, and it raised \$3000. We will approach Stormy further about this possibility.

CST is in need of a volunteer to manage things like fund-raising, working with community charities, and local publicity. We also could use a notary public, to be available to the members and the community in general.

CST has been asked to participate in and help co-coordinate Pagan Pride Day in Auburn, in conjunction with Pantheon, the Auburn University pagan student group, run by Cliff. Some possibilities for locations were mentioned, including the Arboretum or Kiesel Park. Pagan Pride Day has to include a fund-raiser for a community charity. The Battered Women's Shelter was mentioned as a possibility. We could also have a blood drive and/or a bone marrow drive.

The CST Library is still in the works. Stormy has offered space in her house; she has a room that only needs shelves and other furniture, and she is very centrally located. Skippy has offered to catalog the books and maintain the database over the Net.

The next two meetings were scheduled to be held August 12, 2000, in Auburn, Alabama, and November 12, 2000, at FallFling, Dragon Hills, GA.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned at 10:30 pm.
